"Production" to "Lab"

- Instead of the season selection committee working from scratch, titles, spaces, and resources are assigned to labs.
- Labs are requested by instructors of specific classes to complement course content.
- The '06-'07 season is composed of requests from Senior Acting, and Senior & Graduate Directing classes.

"Production" to "Lab"

- With the implementation of the Lab Review Committee, the School of Drama moves into the top 5% of drama programs throughout the U.S. in terms of the level of participation that Dramatic Literature has in the Season Selection process.
- That means that we can rightfully claim to be a leading institution in the level of pedagogical, social, and critical merit of our artistic productions.

- ITP is no longer offered.
- High value content from ITP will move to either Conservatory Hour or an Orientation Session
- Conservatory Hour becomes a stand alone, 1 Unit course
 - Mondays, 5:00-6:20
 - There will be food

- Interpretation & Argument gets an overhaul
- Drama students will have a stand alone section, more carefully crafted to our specific needs

- Introduction to World History has been replaced
- Drama students will now be required to take one semester of the new "Critical Histories of the Arts" course

- "Text to Stage" and "Fundamentals of Drama" are combined and reconfigured
- Drama underclassmen will now take a four semester "Foundations of Drama" course
 - Foundations 1 & 2 rolled out this year
 - Foundations 3 & 4 will start this fall for Sophomores
 - Starting this Fall, students will meet in small discussion sections rather than large seminars. All experimentation shows this is massively beneficial in classroom discipline and all learning outcomes.

- FIGHT AND COMBAT training and progression has been expanded under Catherine Moore's direction.
- FIRST YEAR WARM-UP: Meets 3 days a week using Yoga. With an optional Yoga class offered on Tues and Thurs.
- FACULTY LIAISONS now serve as mentors to productions and maintain professional behavior for junior and senior actors/MT's during a production experience.
