

By Catholic Beliefs, I mean those beliefs that are held in common by *all Christians*: the *Universal* or *Catholic* Church.

In particular they were not debated during the Reformation by the Protestants with the Roman Catholics: they were held in common (except for Sufficiency of Scripture, VI)

Some of these Catholic Doctrines were not believed by the Anabaptists and other sectarian groups



I. Of Faith in the Holy Trinity.

There is but <u>one</u>^a living and true God^b, everlasting^c, without body, parts^d, or <u>passions</u>^e; of infinite power^f, wisdom^g, and goodness^h; the Maker, and Preserver of all things both <u>visible</u> and <u>invisible</u>. And in unity of this Godhead there be <u>three Persons</u>, of one substance, power, and eternity; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost^k.




II. Of the Word or Son of God, which was made very Man.

The Son, which is the Word of the Father, begotten from everlasting of the Father¹, the very^m and eternal Godⁿ, and of one substance^o with the Father, took Man's nature in the womb of the blessed Virgin, of her substance^p: so that two whole and perfect Natures, that is to say, the Godhead and Manhood, were joined together in one Person, never to be divided, whereof is one Christ, very God, and very Man^q; who truly suffered^r, was crucified, dead, and buried^s, to reconcile his Father^t to us, and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for actual sins of men^m.

Of the going down of Christ into Hell.

As Christ died and was buried for us, so also it is to be believed, that he went down to Hell. For the body lay in the Sepulcher, until the resurrection: but his Ghost departing from him, was with the Ghosts that were in prison, or in Hell, and did preach to the same, as the place of St. Peter doth testify.

But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. [8] Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people." [9] (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? [10] He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.)

Acts 2:27: For you will not abandon my soul to *Hades*, or let your Holy One experience corruption.

Acts 2:31: Foreseeing this, David spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, saying, 'He was not abandoned to *Hades*, nor did his flesh experience corruption.'

Hades is the place of the dead, both the righteous and unrighteous, often translated as hell


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
1 Peter 3:18-20

He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, [19] in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, [20] who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water.









IV.Of the Resurrection of Christ (2)

V. Of the Holy Ghost.

The Holy Ghost, proceeding from the Father <u>and</u> the Son, is of one substance, majesty, and glory, with the Father and the Son, very and eternal God.

Not in the original 42: sounds like the Augsburg Confession

This is Western: the so-called *filioque* clause

As to the Sacred scripture, the inspired writers call the holy Ghost the Spirit of the Son (Galatians 4:6), the spirit of Christ (Romans 8:9), the Spirit of Jesus Christ (Phil., i, 19), just as they call Him the Spirit of the Father (Matthew 10:20) and the Spirit of God (1 Corinthians 2:11). Hence they attribute to the Holy Ghost the same relation to the Son as to the Father. Again, according to Sacred Scripture, the Son sends the Holy Ghost (Luke 24:49; John 15:26; 16:7; 20:22; Acts 2:33; Titus 3:6), just as the Father sends the Son (Romans 3:3; etc.), and as the Father sends the Holy Ghost (John 14:26).

VI. Of the Sufficiency of the Holy Scriptures for Salvation.

Holy Scripture¹ containeth all things necessary to salvation^k: so that whatsoever is not read therein, nor may be <u>proved</u> thereby, is not to be <u>required</u> of any man, that it should be believed as an article of the Faith, or be thought requisite or necessary to salvation. In the name of the Holy Scripture we do understand those canonical Books of the Old and New Testament, of whose authority was never any doubt in the Church.

whose authority was <u>never</u> any doubt in the Church was added to the 42.

Of the Names and Number of the Canonical Books

Genesis, The First Book of Samuel, The Book of Esther,

Exodus, The Second Book of Samuel, The Book of Job,

Leviticus, The First Book of Kings, The Psalms,

Numbers, The Second Book of Kings, The Proverbs,

Deuteronomy, The First Book of Chronicles, Ecclesiastes

Joshua, The Second Book of Chronicles, Songs of Solomon,

Judges, The First Book of Esdras, Four Prophets, greater,

Ruth, The Second Book of Esdras, Twelve Prophets, less.

Note: 1 and 2 Esdras are the names in the LXX for Ezra and Nehemiah

Note also that there are only 38 books above: Lamentations must be included with Jeremiah The Book of Tobias, The Book of Judith, The rest of the Book of Esther The Book of Wisdom of Solomon **Ecclesiasticus, or the Wisdom of Jesus the Son of Sirach Baruch the Prophet,** The Song of the Three Children, The Story of Susanna, Of Bel and the Dragon The First Book of Maccabees, The Second Book of Maccabees.

The Canon taught in the 39 Articles is the same as most of the Reformed and Confessional Protestant Churches of the Reformation.

The historical basis of the canon is that it is the canon sited in Athanasius's Festal Letter of 367, that of Jerome and that of the Council of Carhage, 397.

In the 16th century at Trent (1546) the RCC included the apocrypha in the Bible

all things necessary to <u>salvation</u>^k:

Not other thinkgs like worship! See Article XX

required of any man, that it should be believed as an article of the Faith¹,

of whose authority was <u>never</u> any doubt in the Church. Why do we believe the Bible?

By the church's authority

Because it is God's Word and self authenticating?



And the *other* Books (as Hierome saith) the Church doth read for example of life and instruction of manners; but yet doth it not apply them to establish any doctrine; such are these following:





VII. Of the Old Testament.

The Old Testament is not contrary to the New: for both in the Old and New Testament everlasting life is offered to Mankind by Christ, who is the only Mediator between God and Man, being both God and Man. Wherefore they are not to be heard, which feign that the old Fathers did look only for transitory promises. Although the Law given from God by Moses, as touching Ceremonies and Rites, do not bind Christian men, nor the Civil precepts thereof ought of necessity to be received in any commonwealth; yet notwithstanding, no Christian man whatsoever is free from the obedience of the Commandments which are called Moral.

VIII. Of the Creeds.

The Nicene Creed, and that which is commonly called the Apostles' Creed, ought thoroughly to be received and believed: for they may be proved by most certain warrants of Holy Scripture.

The original Article given Royal assent in 1571 and reaffirmed in 1662, was entitled, "Of the Three Creeds"; and began as follows, "The Three Creeds, Nicene Creed, Athanasius's Creed, and that which is commonly called the Apostles' Creed..."

The Puritans did not like this article because:

- 1. The Apostles did not write the Apostles' Creed
- 2. The Nicene Creed is better called the Nicene Constantinople Creed
- 3. The Athanasian Creed was not written by Saint Athanasius
- But they believed what was in the Apostles and Nicene Creed except perhaps for the decent to hell and some of the details of the Person of Christ
